This 1-day / 8-hour instructor development course is based on the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) Law Enforcement Tactical Casualty Care course and the U.S. military's Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC) course, but modified to address specific issues associated with gunshot wounds and other injuries sustained during live-fire training on a range or in a shoot house. This course is taught by instructors who are both firearms instructors and certified EMTs / Paramedics. Portions of this course are conducted under live-fire conditions.

Topics Covered:

- Safety briefing on protocols for trauma emergencies
- Use of a tourniquet
- Use of hemostatic agents
- Wound packing and dressing
- Use of chest seals
- Treating eye injuries
- Identifying and treating the onset of shock
- Communication and coordination with EMS
- Treat in place vs. self-transport
- Transitioning from medical scene to investigative scene

Required Equipment:

- Trauma kit (if you have one, not required)
- Pistol, magazines, and duty or belt holster
- 50 rounds of pistol ammo
- Rifle with tactical sling and 1 magazine (optional)
- 50 rounds of rifle ammo (optional)
- Hat with a brim
- Eye & ear protection
- Hydration fluids and snacks
