David Jordan has been a police officer for a major agency in Arizona since 2001. He served several years as a patrol officer before being selected to the Firearms Training Unit. While serving at the FTU David conducted handgun, shotgun, and rifle training, and trained both recruits and in-service personnel. David then served on the agency's Safety Unit as a Safety Officer responsible for the safety and training of the department's Dive Team, WMD/PPE program, and SCBA program. David also continued to serve as an adjunct firearms instructor. David created his Department's EMS program and is currently the coordinator for it. This program adapted nationally recognized training within the EMS community for law enforcement.



David promoted to Sergeant in 2016 and served as a Patrol Sergeant for a year before being selected as a Rangemaster to oversee the agency's patrol rifle program. After performing that job for over a year, Dave returned to the Safety Unit as the supervisor where he continues to serve today.

David is a certified paramedic with the state of Arizona and national registry, NREMT. David is a NAEMT instructor and is certified to teach PHTLS, TCCC, LEFR, and other related courses.

Combining his firearms and medical expertise David has worked to improve safety on the range with lead blood testing, noise monitoring, and dust control. He took his medical experience and adapted it to meet the needs of firearms instructors. David also developed range trauma kits that make sense for instructors to use.

David created the *Live-Fire Training Casualty Care Course* as one of instructor development courses for NLEFIA.
