Victor Rosado retired as a Sergeant from the Phoenix Police Department. He has 25 years of law enforcement experience, four of which as a police supervisor. Prior to beginning his career in law enforcement, Victor served in the US Army as an Infantryman.

Over the course of his career, Victor has worked in fugitive apprehension; high risk warrants service, barricaded subjects, patrol operations, plain-clothes anti-crime, and OCB narcotics. During his tenure with his department's Tactical Support Bureau, he served as an entry team member. Duties and responsibilities included that of a certified EMT-B, Breacher, Grenadier, Less Lethal Operator, and Crisis Negotiator.

He has provided training to law enforcement officers at all skill levels from the basic academy and field training to in-service training and tactical personnel. He has prepared numerous training outlines and reviewed policies on use of force, tactics, firearms, technology, and training. Victor also served on his department's Tactical Review Sub-committee. This panel was responsible for the review of critical incidents and use-of-force.

Victor is an AZPOST certified firearms instructor in handgun, rifle, and shotgun. He holds an AZPOST instructor certification in high-risk vehicle stops, defensive tactics, and as a physical fitness. He is a live-fire shoot house instructor and served as a rangemaster for the ALEA training center.
